Visitor Safeguarding Information

All Visitors to Hope House School must report to Reception on arrival.

Please sign in and wear your visitors' lanyard.

You will be told if there is a Fire Drill planned.

The disabled toilets are in the south block.

Personal mobile telephones must be kept on silent and should be kept securely.

We are a non-smoking site – This includes vaping.

You must not have any smoking/vaping equipment on your person.

Any food must be consumed in the dining room.

Please be aware we have CCTV on site for monitoring purposes

British Values

Support fundamental British Values and our school values:

Be consistent with the ethos of the school and not marginalise any communities, groups, or individuals:

Not seek to glorify criminal activity or violent extremism or seek to radicalise students through extreme or narrow views of faith, religion or culture or other ideologies.

Be aware of appropriate boundaries with a child

Behave in a mature, safe, respectful, fair and considerate manner.

Adhere to all of the schools' policies and procedures.

Safeguarding Information

Hope House School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people.

We expect our staff, including supply staff and volunteers to share this commitment.

The concerns you have may be part of a bigger picture, which could help to prevent serious harm to a young person.

Giving families help at an early stage.

Never keep concerns about the safety of a young person to yourself.

Remember these 3 important things:

1. All children have a right to be safe no matter who they are or what their circumstances.
2. Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
3. We all need to listen to children, even though we may not always be comfortable with what we hear.
