

Hope House School is a registered centre for ASDAN (Award Scheme Development & Accreditation Network).

The Careers and Experiencing Work Short Course has been produced to support the delivery of careers and work-related education, and to help with planning and undertaking work experience/placements. It has been developed in line with the [statutory careers guidance](#) (January 2018). The challenges within the course have been mapped to the [Gatsby Benchmark's framework](#) and the course is referenced in the [Gatsby Benchmark toolkit](#) (page 26).

ASDAN Workright course provides a framework to develop a range of basic transferable employability skills. It can be used in a variety of settings, including schools, FE, training providers and day care services.

The Employability qualifications provide a framework for developing and recognising general employability skills at Entry 2 to Level 2. They are suitable for use with pre-16 and post-16 learners.

ASDAN was given full endorsement for the Employability qualifications by Asset Skills, the Sector Skills Council which had responsibility for Employability skills and qualifications. ASDAN featured in a report commissioned by the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills and UKES which reviewed the impact of generic Employability qualifications.
